ABOUT THE DARLA J. TWALE FAITH-BASED COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship was established by Darla J. Twale. Dr. Twale is an alumnae of Elizabeth Forward High School (Class of 1969) and Geneva College (Class of 1973). She has graduate degrees from Duquesne University (1976) and University of Pittsburgh (1980 and 1985). Dr. Twale taught briefly at EF and taught in higher education administration graduate programs a total of 25 years at Auburn University, the University of Dayton, and the University of Pittsburgh. In 2015, she was inducted into the Elizabeth Forward High School Hall of Fame.

TERMS OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

One \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Elizabeth Forward High School who will study as a full-time student at a four-year, not-for-profit FAITH-BASED (Catholic, Protestant, or Jewish) college or university. A faith-based college or university is private and affiliated with a particular religious denomination. Like any charity, it operates on a not-for-profit basis.

SELECTION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

Selection will be based on merit as judged by the Scholarship Selection Committee. This scholarship is intended for the student who challenges him/herself, gets good grades, participates in worthwhile activities, holds active church membership, makes good choices in life, and lives in service to others. The response to the prompt below will also be considered. A reference letter is required from your pastor or church group leader, or a general character reference that addresses your church and community service.

NOTIFICATION AND RECEIPT OF SCHOLARSHIP

The recipient will be notified by early May via e-mail or text message and a confirmation letter. The letter will inform the recipient of what needs to be provided to EFAPA to receive the scholarship. Information relating to a required thank you letter will be included with the confirmation letter.

THE APPLICATION

1. Using word processing, submit the following information. Include the number/letter of the item when providing your information.

2. As a separate document, prepare an up-to-date personal resume that includes your academic achievements, senior-year courses, extracurricular activities, and church and community service, etc.
 3. Make two copies of all application materials (including your essay, resume, reference letter) and collate them into two separate packets so each packet contains one copy of each document and then staple each packet.
 4. Place both packets into one unsealed 9 x 12 envelope.
 5. Write your name and the scholarship name on the outside of the envelope.
 6. Submit all materials to your guidance counselor as soon as possible but not later than February 28.
 7. Request that your counselor provide EFAPA with your EFHS academic transcript.
